The Economics undergraduate program emphasizes that economics is an analytical way of thinking, not facts to be memorized. ECON teaches students to analyze issues involving resource allocation and strategic thinking from business, law, government, and other fields. Economics students apply theoretical and empirical techniques to study topics like inflation, unemployment, tax reform, government deficits, regulations, pollution, market success/failure, and protectionism.
